

- Shoot in landscape, find something to prop your phone up on where we can see what your hands are doing and as much as your face as possible. It's best not to ask someone else to film it for you as they are likely to wobble as they film. If you have a laptop try resting it on the keyboard whilst it is open.
- Before filming, give your lens a good wipe.
- Make sure you have **great lighting** and minimal shadows on your project or workspace. You don't need a pro lighting kit; several uplighters or regular lamps work just as well.
- Try a test video before you start, make sure the audio isn't muffled or rubbing against anything.
- Keep the project in the center of the screen if possible
- Shoot your video in high-definition if you can.
- Don't play any music in the background, and try to record your video in a quiet room.
- Introduce yourself and what you're planning on making.
- Try and clearly delineate the stages, saying something like "the next step is".
- Do as many close ups to the camera as you can, showing the detail of what you've done.
- If you're not comfortable editing your footage, let us know and we can do this for you.
